the first moneys collected.

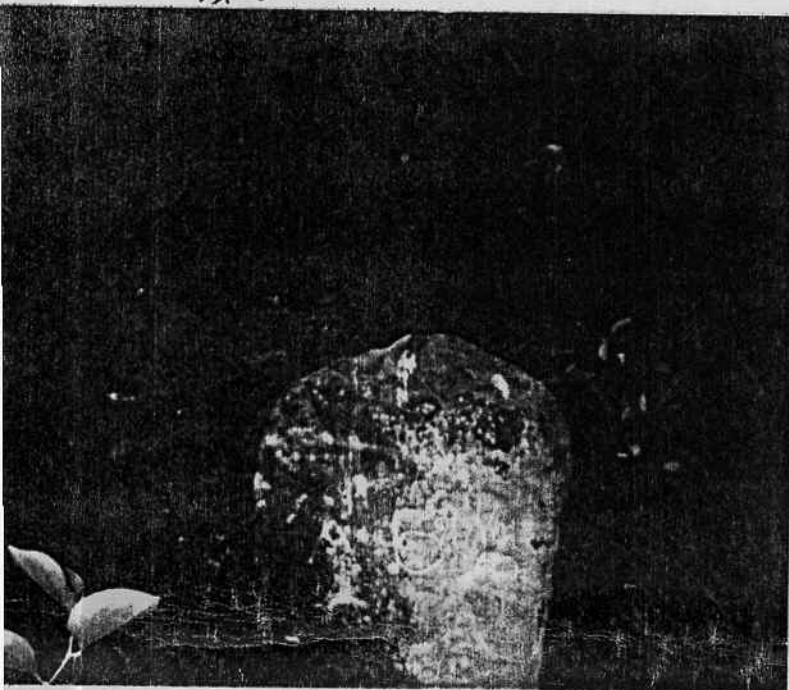
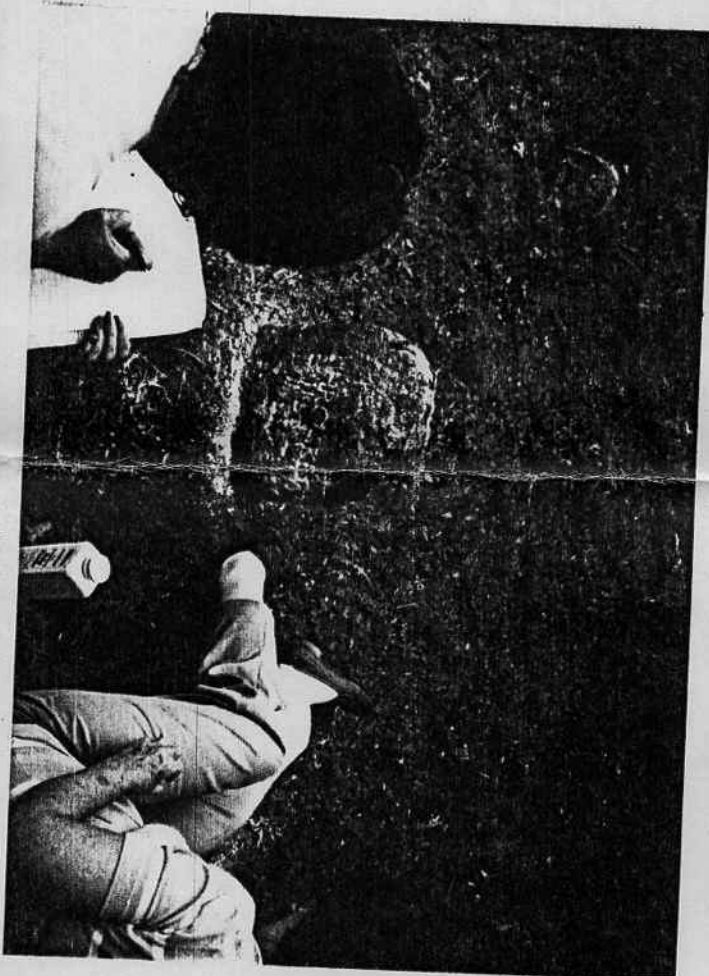
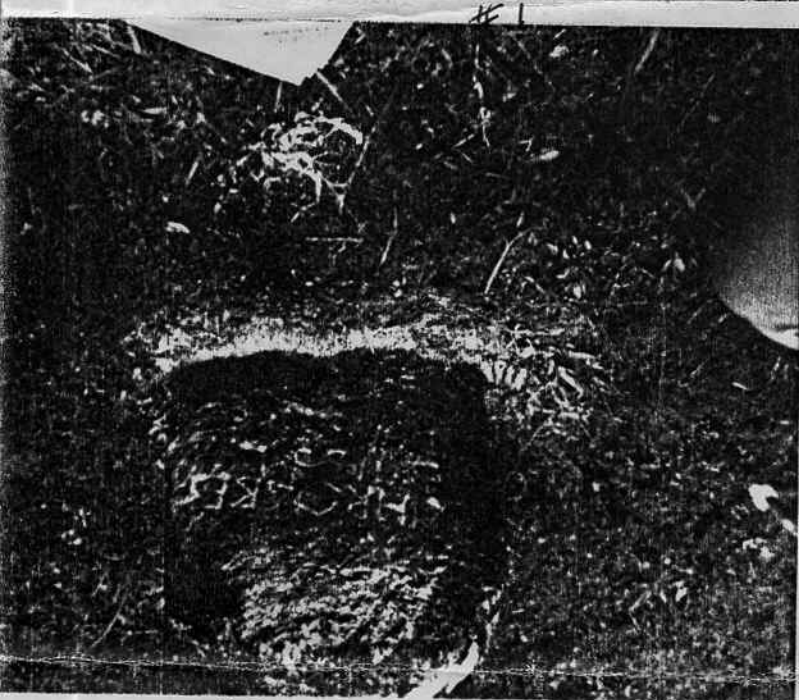
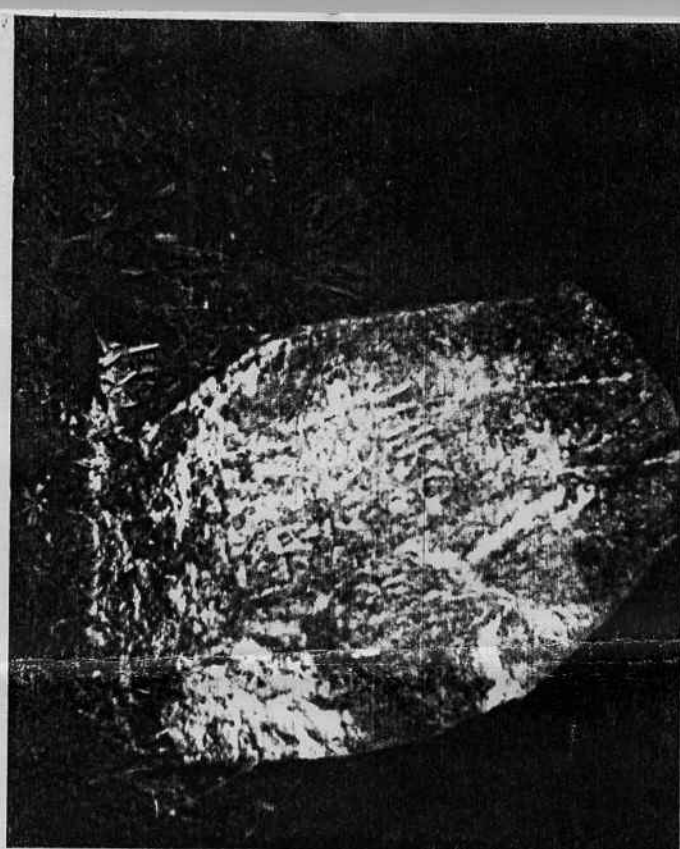
Eleventh I give and bequeath to Willie
